**Tate Selected To Serve On COF Public Policy Committee**

**York, PA** \_\_ Bryan Tate, Vice President for Community Investment at York County Community Foundation, has been selected to serve on the Council on Foundations' Public Policy Committee through 2010. The Committee provides recommendations regarding legislative issues and the development of policy relevant to the philanthropy sector. The Council on Foundations is the national professional philanthropic association based in Washington, D.C.

"I am proud to serve at the national level," Tate says. "Now more than ever, the nonprofit community needs to advocate at all levels of government, particularly in Washington. The Public Policy Committee provides that unified voice that will certainly have a positive impact on philanthropy."

The Public Policy Committee will typically meet three times a year by conference call or in-person meetings. It will begin its work with a strategic planning process that will establish both short- and long-term objectives and goals.

Tate is responsible for leading and managing the Community Foundation's grantmaking programs and related special initiatives. He provides community leadership by initiating and participating in collaborative projects with the region's civic, business, and government leaders and with other grantmakers.

A native of York County and graduate of Temple University, Tate joined the Community Foundation early in 2004 after having spent 12 years as Chief of Staff to Congressman Todd Platts (PA-19). Tate is active in community organizations and is a Paul Harris Fellow of Rotary Club of York, President of the Board of the Central PA Leadership Seminar of Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership, and is founder of the Spring Grove Alumni Chorus.
