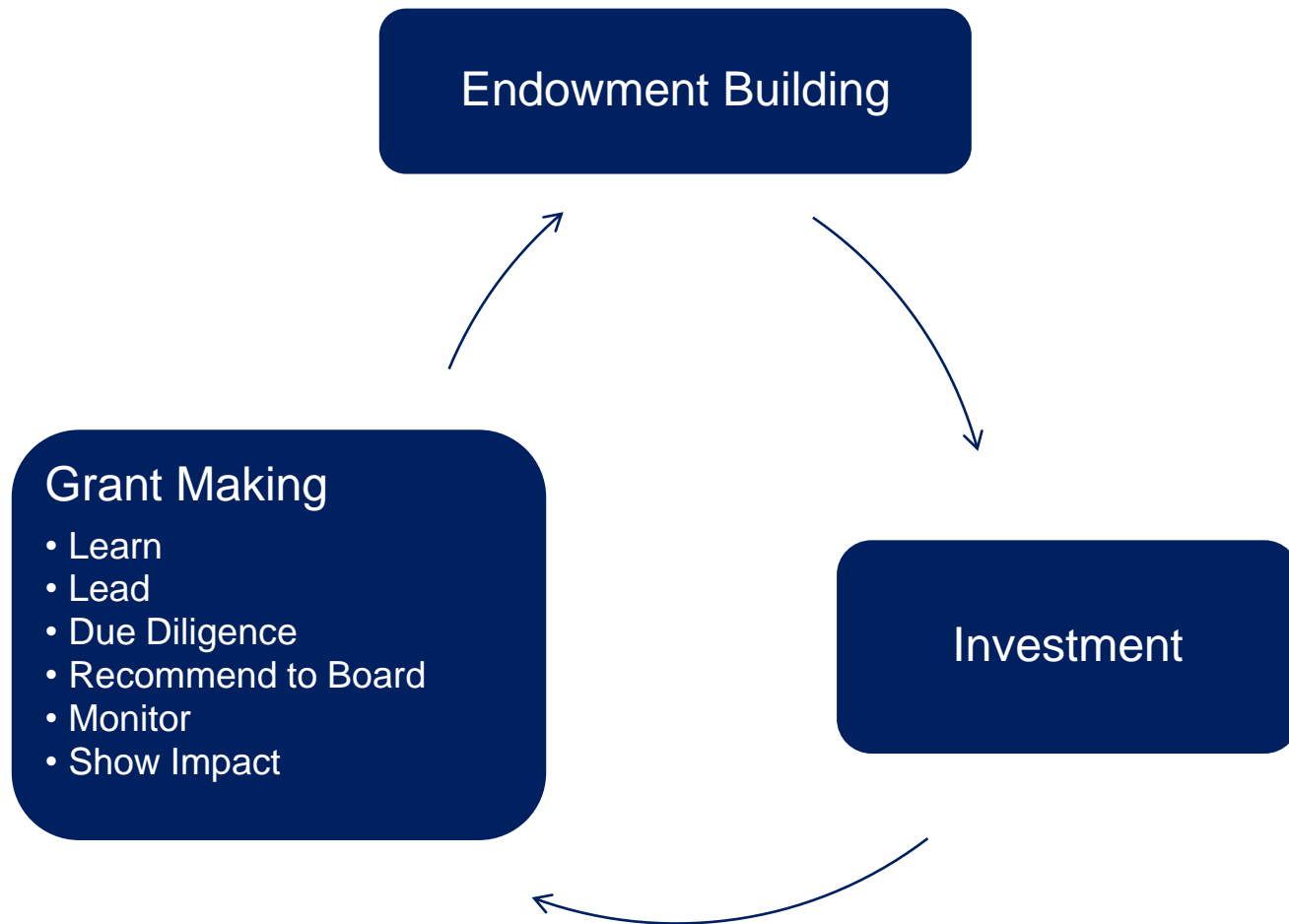


York County Community Foundation MISSION

- **Leverage new resources**



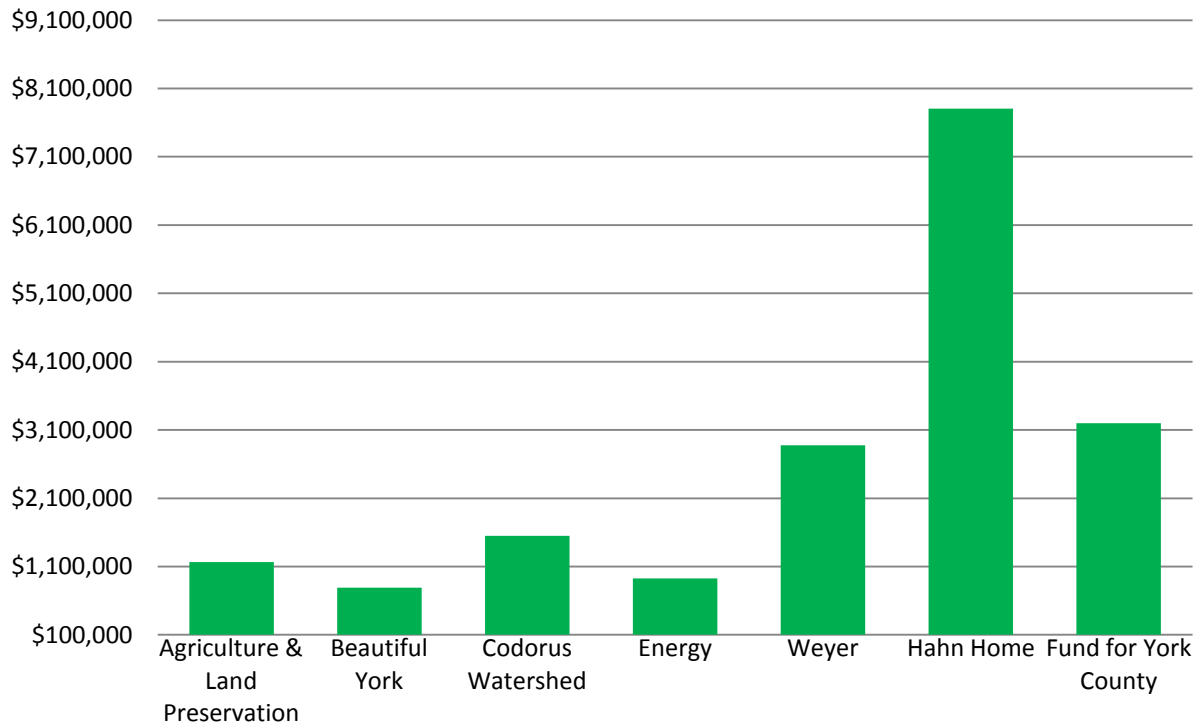

Field of Interest Fund Balance Comparisons

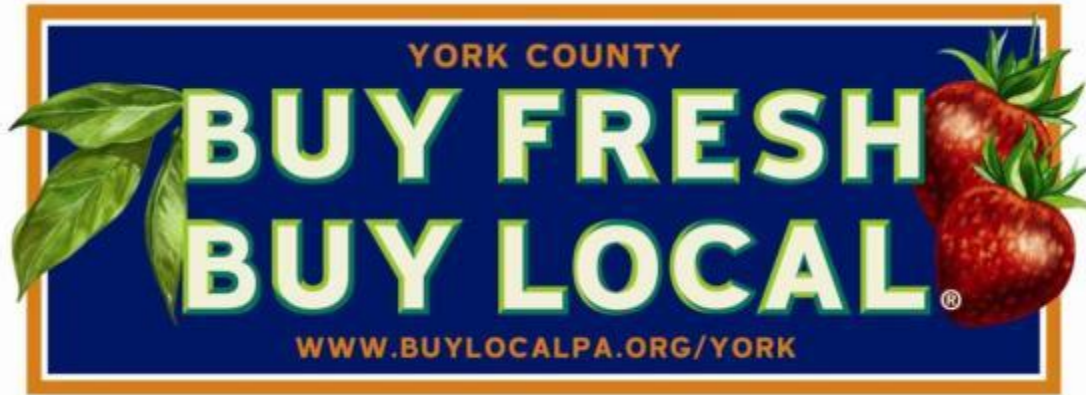

Fund for York County 2011 Competitive Grants Program

Priorities:

- Address community need
- Strategic and significant impact
- Collaboration
- Leverages other dollars

Things to remember:

- Quality of application
- Statement of community need being met
- Realistic budget
- Measure results

2011 Competitive Grants Program Fund for York County

Nonprofit Strategic Alliances Program:

- Two or more nonprofit organizations consolidating services, locations or merging to advance their missions, improve service delivery, increase efficiency and strengthen sustainability.
- Maximum grant amount is \$20,000 for costs to facilitate and implement the alliance.
- **No deadline.** Nonprofit organizations pursuing strategic alliances should contact Jane Conover, Vice President of Community Investment at 848-3733 when they are ready to discuss their proposal.
- Applicants with viable plans will be invited to submit a full proposal and attend a Fund for York County Committee meeting to discuss the proposal in person.

Fall 2011 Competitive Grants Program

- Applications accepted to support program-specific expenses that are time-limited project.
- Maximum grant amount is \$5000.
- **Deadline for submission is September 1, 2011 by 5 p.m.**
- Qualified applications not funded through the Competitive Grants Program will be made available to the Foundation's donor advisors to consider for funding.

- PART I – GRANT APPLICATION SUMMARY FORM
- PART II – PROPOSAL NARRATIVE
- PART III – PROPOSAL BUDGET
- PART IV – ORGANIZATION'S GOVERNING BOARD
- PART V – CORRESPONDENCE FROM PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS

Post Grant Report

- Measurable outcomes
 - Outcome = changed/improved/reduced skill, behavior, health etc.
 - Measurement = % of people achieving that change, or % increase in participation etc.
 - Outputs = numbers served, classes held etc.
- Percent of outcomes achieved
- Three top benefits
